A special invitation on behalf of the Chancel Choir...

Over the past few weeks, parents at Massanutten Presbyterian received information on the children's music program which begins its second year on September 11. It is easy for us to encourage our children to participate in this activity because we know how important it is to their growth and to the church. Music provides an opportunity to worship through a medium that is concurrently intellectual and emotional. While singing or playing artistically is intentional activity requiring skills and intellect, it is impossible to do so without investing an element of one's self into the process. The result is an act of worship with all our mind, heart and strength.

Ensemble music also gives us the opportunity to join others for the unified purpose of enhancing our corporate worship. This activity provides fellowship and support in a Christ-centered activity which is the essence of what it means to "glorify God and enjoy Him forever."

We could all be effective and sincere promoters of the children's music program because we know what it does for them and the church. But there is a corollary point: **all of the opportunities that are available to the children are also available to the older members of the church through the adult music program.** I would especially encourage participation in the Chancel Choir program. The choir provides the opportunity to meet and worship as a group, as well as to focus on how we can witness our faith to each other and the congregation through music. It is a group in which all gifts are welcome, encouragement is pervasive and there is no hint of competition in the task at hand.

There are innumerable demands on our time, but the choir affords us a time of Christian reflection and re-creation that is necessary in these times because they are so busy. In completing the plans for the coming year, please consider offering some of your time and talent to the choir. I can almost guarantee you will find the task to be one of service and joy...a process that provides fellowship, witness, and growth.

A Few Moments with our New Members:

- The Washingtons

Actor and comedian George Burns once said, "The secret of a good sermon is to have a good beginning and a good ending, then to have the two as close together as possible." Stacey Washington might be among the first to vote for longer sermons, though, since the ones at MPC always leave her laughing.

Stacey and husband Mike Washington live in McGeheysville with their children Ryan (7) and twin daughters Lydia and Emily (5). They both grew up in the Valley and have extended family in the area. In fact, above all interests and hobbies, both count family time as the most special. "We just try to spend as much time with family as we can," says busy mom Stacey, who serves as instructional assistant at Cub Run Elementary School. In this new, part-time position, Stacey assists in the kindergarten classes, special education classes for pre-schoolers, and provides SOL tutoring for 4th and 5th graders. It is a role she finds "incredibly enriching" and she hopes to transition to full-time employment as soon as possible.

Mike has been deputy sheriff for Rockingham County for approximately 8 years, a position which he very much enjoys as well. He's also a loyal Washington Redskins fan, "though he's not always eager to admit it," Stacey adds with a laugh.

The Washington kids stay active with "typical kid things," according to Stacey. Ryan loves baseball, soccer and video games. The twins enjoy tee-ball, and all three love swimming and playing in the backyard.

Outside of home and school, Stacey continues to connect with families as the current president of the local chapter of ARCMOM (Augusta and Rockingham Counties Mothers of Multiples). Understanding that parenting multiples is a unique challenge, she and her colleagues schedule presentations by therapists, grown twins, and parents of older multiples who can share their experiences. "It's really neat to meet new moms and give them help as well as reassurance, and to meet older moms who've been through what we're going through now," says Stacey. Before visiting MPC, Stacey had worshipped at other churches, but never felt the right fit for her family. She grew up Presbyterian and was familiar with some of the faces in our congregation, so thought she'd visit. "My first visit was Pastor John's first day back to MPC after his sabbatical," says Stacey. "His sermon was really, really funny." At some point, she looked around and realized her children already knew a lot of the children in our church family. She connected with some family friends in our congregation as well, including Bob and Doris Fields, (Bob is the pastor who had married her parents in Bedford, Va. many years ago.) Stacey also continued to enjoy her worship experience. "Pastor John even talked about Facebook in one sermon," she says. "It was awesome!" Between the humorous sermons and familiar faces, MPC felt like home. Stacey and family joined in March.

Looking forward, Stacey is enthusiastic about becoming more active at MPC. "My children know so many of the kids here and I'm excited about getting them together through the many children's programs the church has to offer." She enjoyed assisting with Vacation Bible School, which the kids loved, and is looking forward to her first stint as a nursery volunteer in the fall.

We are glad the Washingtons have chosen MPC as their new church home and will enjoy hearing their laughter in the pews on Sunday morning. Welcome Stacey and family!

Massanutten Cares –

with international emphasis

It is estimated that 925 million people are undernourished throughout the world. This number has decreased slightly in the past two years, however it is still exceedingly high. Massanutten is involved in a variety of hunger ministries. These include a food pantry which assists families in our local area; support for the Blue Ridge Area Food Bank which resources food pantries and other hunger relief efforts in a larger area; and a monthly Four-Cents-per-Meal offering which supports hunger related concerns in the Rockingham/Harrisonburg area and across the world. On **October 15** we have the opportunity to explore a new hunger reducing effort through **Stop Hunger Now** (www.stophungernow.org). The vision of this organization is simple, but not easy: *A World Without Hunger; the mission, extraordinary: To end hunger in our lifetime by providing food and life-saving aid to the world's most vulnerable and by creating a global commitment to mobilize the necessary resources.*

One of the ways **Stop Hunger Now** is moving toward their vision is through the packaging of emergency food packets that provide nourishment through a variety of ingredients designed for under-nourished children and adults. Groups and congregations like ours have come together in order to package this food source to send to areas in the world where, for many reasons, hunger is an issue.

Join us on October 15 when we will host a **Stop Hunger Now** packaging event at the church beginning at 9:00 a.m. All are invited to participate. If you are unable to be here but would like to contribute, each meal package costs 25 cents. We hope to package 10,000 meals that day! Financial gifts can be made out to Massanutten, noting: “Stop Hunger Now” in the memo section.

OR perhaps you have a particular gift for sewing. Bring along a sewing machine and some thread that day and join the team that will be making **Little Dresses for Africa** (www.littledressesforafrica.org).

Little Dresses for Africa is a non-profit 501c3, Christian-based organization which provides relief to the children of Africa. Simple dresses are made out of pillow cases and distributed through orphanages, churches and schools in Africa to plant in the hearts of little girls that they are *worthy!*

Following our packaging and sewing projects, mission co-worker Karla Ann Koll and Juana Herlinda Yac Salanic will speak about the work of the Presbyterian Church in Guatemala.
