Though the eight hour drives were tough cramped in the two vans, it was obvious that everyone had a fantastic time at Myrtle Beach. The counselors of Team Effort Mission Camp were young and full of energy, and every night they put on a worship service that had singing, dancing, and fun games for a select number of volunteers to participate in. Coming Soon: A Better Parking Lot...

In response to numerous comments received during the Visioning Process, an effort to expand the usefulness and convenience of our parking lot is underway! The *Property Ministry* has studied the congregation's parking needs, consulting with a variety of church groups over the last year.

The results of this study are:

(1) The Plan:

Notable features of the plan include:

- An overall increase of 24 lined parking spaces; including specifically designated spaces (handicapped, visitor, senior and "stork" spots)
- A more efficient traffic pattern
- Re-sealing and lining the entire lot
- A more welcoming, visible church entrance with an elevated flower bed and new walkway;

(2) The Wonderful Offer:

Gary Blosser has graciously offered to provide a gift of labor, equipment and materials to help accomplish a significant portion of this plan. The Session joyfully and with thanksgiving accepted his generous offer. The expenses for resealing and line-stripping are already in the current budget. *Work will begin within a few weeks.*

What You Should Know:

To make room for some of the additional spots, several trees will be removed near the front entrance. The garden at this main entrance will be improved with new landscaping. There may be some temporary inconvenience as these projects get underway. Watch for cones and signs to guide parking during this time.

"Journeys In Faith"

Sunday Morning Opportunities for Adults at MPC

Adult Electives:

We found the 6 week elective format for Sunday school very effective for many of our adult participants. Similar options will be offered for adults on Sunday mornings again this year. We will also have a few that actually span 2 terms, making them about 12 week options. Here are the electives for September 12 – October 17, 2010:

"God Surprises Us with Grace" This is the theme for this year's Faith Village stories. This class will look at the 6 Bible stories from an adult as well as a child's perspective. Come discover new insights into some old favorites such as The Prodigal Son/Compassionate Father, King David, and Feeding of the 5,000 to name a few! This class will be led by a team of teachers and meets in Room 114.

"Death and the Afterlife: An Introduction" This 11-week class (September 12—November 21) will explore questions about death and what lies beyond. Beginning with a look at scripture and Christian tradition, the class will consider topics including the soul, bodily resurrection, salvation, heaven, hell, and near death experiences. John Irvine and Collier Harvey will lead this class. Participants will need a copy of the book used for this class. Cost of the book is \$16.00. Please contact Nancy Ruh if interested in attending this class and ordering this resource. The class will meet in Room 117 (Parlor).

"Uncommon Gratitude: Alleluia for All Things" Using a book of the same title, this class will explore how we might experience a 'life of alleluia.' In this class participants will discover how one can realistically offer praise and wonder in the face of the often uncertain or discouraging circumstances of ordinary life. Our reflections will be rooted in the conviction that God is good, and all of life--including doubt, death, conflict, wealth--is life-giving. Leaders for this class have not yet been determined. This class will meet in the Gathering Area.

"Hallelujah: The Bible and Handel's Messiah" will begin on November 28 for those looking for a special Advent class.

The Covenant Class:

This class, designed and led by Dick Miller, will resume this fall. The class meets in Room 119 (lower level). This is an on-going class, primarily lecture-based, with discussion of topics pertinent to our faith.

Change is coming...

A letter was sent to families introducing our new age / grade grouping for Sunday School, Youth Groups and Confirmation. The following groupings were carefully considered by Family Ministry, and we will be implementing them in September 2010:

Sunday School:

- Kindergarteners will be combined with 4 year old preschoolers in a "traditional" style class.
- Faith Village Sunday School will now include 1st grade through 6th grade children, the age range recommended by those who originally developed the Workshop Rotation Model.
- The Middle School Sunday School will include 7th and 8th grade only.
- Our High School Sunday School Class will consist of students in grades 9 through 12.

Sunday Evening Youth Fellowship Groups:

- Our Middle School Youth Fellowship will be split into two groups:
 - We will introduce a new youth fellowship group this fall for 5th and 6th grade youth that will meet at least once every 6 – 8 weeks – *Club 56*.
 - Sunday evening Middle School Youth Group (*YEPOGS*) will include 7th and 8th graders and will meet twice a month, the second and fourth Sundays of the month.
- Our High School Youth Group (*UBs*) will continue to include 9th through 12th graders, also meeting the second and fourth Sundays.

Confirmation Class:

- The minimum age for participating in Confirmation Class is 13 years and at least 8th grade.
- This class will meet on Sunday afternoons during late winter / early spring of 2011.
- More details will be sent to parents and youth at a later date.

Teen Disciple Course...

This fall we will offer a Disciple Bible Study course for 9th—12th grade youth. A New Era of Ministry

Status of Campaign July 1, 2010:

- Total amount of New Era monies applied toward the principal to date is \$257,278.
- Current total pledged amount is \$619,000 (51% of the \$1.2 million goal.)

- At the current rate of payment (New Era and budgeted mortgage payments) the outstanding mortgage debt will drop below \$2 million in September, 2010.
