The Beauty of Shouting Stones

At the far edge of our backyard, where the grass ends, a row of rocks marks the boundary of some long-forgotten herb garden which was planted by the former owners. That rock edging continues to do what it was built for, marking the end of one thing and the beginning of another.

A few months ago, just after Easter, we added six new stones to that boundary. These stones were a bit different, as they were river rocks which had been used in Sunday School to teach the story of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem, a story which we remember on Palm Sunday each year.

With the help of their teachers, my children and the others in their classes had transformed those "silent" stones into "shouting" stones, calling to mind what Jesus had said to those who wanted him to silence his disciples: "If these were silent, even the stones would cry out." (Perhaps you remember seeing them on your way into Massanutten last April.)

Ever since we placed them there, those stones have been shouting to me whenever I get near enough to see them, reminding me of God's presence in the midst of life. They have lifted my spirits, birthing in me a hope that God will indeed move to set things right.

Often when I see them, I give thanks to the adults who helped my children bring them to life. I remember our Faith Village Writing Team who crafted the lesson. I remember the teachers who brought that lesson plan to life. And I can almost see some adult leaning to help one of my children design and paint their shouting stones, and, by doing so, helping to shape their faith in such an amazing way. What those teachers did, you see, is to encourage my children to become shouting stones themselves, to find their place in the community of faith.

As you will see from the articles in this newsletter, our programs for nurture and growth will soon begin a new season. Will you consider answering a call to help our community of faith in our responsibility to nurture not only our children and youth, but people of all ages as we journey in faith? What you can offer as a teacher or assistant will impact lives in incredible ways. Who knows? You may even help a stone to shout.

The BIG EVENT

**A Time for Worship, Learning, and Sharing.
September 10, 2011.**

Massanetta Springs Conference Center

The Second Annual BIG EVENT brings together learning opportunities in all areas of ministry and is open to the whole presbytery. Churches are encouraged to send groups of leaders from different areas of their ministries to gather new ideas and to be recharged for another year of ministry. The Mission Fair will again fill the halls with displays and information about what is being done and about how you can get involved.

Fall Opportunities for Children...

While most of us are in flip flop and backyard barbecue mode, MPC staff and volunteers are busy planning another exciting year of Christian education programs for our youngsters. Unlike the classic Sunday school format we may remember from *our* youth, however, these dynamic and imaginative programs help bring the word of God alive for four-year-olds through grade six.

Before morning worship, first through sixth graders are invited to attend **Faith Village**, a Sunday school experience based on the workshop rotation model. Here, students participate in art, drama, science, cooking, puppetry, Bible games, music and much more. These interactive lessons are designed to keep students moving, and to engage and inspire them in their faith. A light breakfast is served from 9:00-9:10 and workshops begin at 9:15. New this year: stories will be presented for four weeks instead of six, allowing for the addition of three stories each year!

During worship, children who will be four years old by September 30, 2011 through those who are in first grade are welcomed to **Godly Play**, an interactive, Montessori-style class which stimulates children's curiosity and enhances their innate sense of the presence of God. Through parable, sacred story, liturgical activities, prayer and silence, children develop Christian language which helps them to make meaning in their lives. Parents and grandparents serve as "doorkeepers" who greet participants as they enter the room. The class concludes with fellowship time centered around communion and community building.

Godly Play graduates move on to **Children's Church**. Here, second graders will be offered a 10 to 12 week class on worship education in preparation for attending the entire worship service in Advent. A new curriculum is being written for this class, which helps students understand the structure, meaning and style of our worship in the sanctuary. Upon graduation from Children's Church, students receive a Bible and worship bag filled with activities to help enhance their worship experience as they grow.

Whether new to our church or "veterans", your children are warmly welcomed to these programs, which begin in September. Watch for more details in the coming weeks!

Missions Updates

News from our Partner-in-Mission* serving in Central Asia

**Due to the sensitive nature of the area in which she serves we are unable to print her name or specific location. A full update is available at the church for those who would like to read more.*

Our mission partner has been on the field for over two years. Her experiences have deepened her commitment to Jesus Christ and the service to which she has been called. Each month she provides us with a glimpse of her life since her ministry began. Here is a bit of what she shares for July:

In the nearby bazaar, I frequent the little stand of a young man I've dubbed "my banana boy." He delights in telling me about his country's holidays. Right now, main street has been resurfaced in preparation for the fall celebration of the country's 20-year independence. He has begun telling me about the preparations. He is proud of his country and wants to make sure I understand each holiday. Last week when he saw me at a distance, he waved me to his stand and greeted me warmly. While that's our normal greeting for each other, that's not a normal greeting between men and women here. A man showing the utmost respect to a woman will hardly acknowledge her...

In this culture, dreams and visions are a reality and are considered messages from God. A few years ago a man had a vision of (the country). He saw a wall around the country that had been constructed to keep out God's word. More recently, the same man had another vision of (the country). The wall was there, but now it has huge holes in it through which the wind is bringing the word of God to the people of this country. The wall is breaking down because of the prayers of people like you who lift up this country and its people...!

Please continue to lift me and the work here. I am in the middle of a terribly, terribly busy summer with my office work and ministry. You may think that because you are so far away that you do not have any impact. But the opposite is true. Your partnership is vital and your impact is great.

Please pick up the full July update at the church and continue to keep our partner-in-mission in prayer.

Continuing Ministry in A New Nation: South Sudan

The PCUSA has five mission co-workers in the new country of South Sudan. They all have great ministries and high energy to help the people among whom they minister. They include Jacob George and his wife Aliamma.

Jacob teaches at Giffen Bible School. Aliamma is a registered nurse. This couple is originally from India and Jacob served as pastor and teacher at a church in Houston for nearly 30 years.

Ingrid Reneau has a doctorate in English literature from Rutgers and taught 5 years at the University of South Carolina. Since 2007 she has been helping the church-run school system in southern Sudan.

Nancy McGaughey is a registered nurse and has worked with ACROSS, a partner agency tasked with ministry to refugees returning to South Sudan, since 2009. Previously she served 15 years in Nepal.

Debbie Blane teaches future pastors of churches at Nile Theological College. She is a minister member of Cascades Presbytery.

All of them need prayer support as they go through a joyful yet fragile time.
