“Lord, when was it that we saw you..?” *from Matthew 25:37-39*

At the heart of the gospel is the message: *‘we are loved.’* God comes to us as an infant, born in humble means, a rabbi teaching through miracles and parables and as savior restoring us and giving us new life. The depth to which God has gone to love us prompts and compels our response.

“Lord, when was it that we saw you...?” This question in Matthew is prompted by the king’s description of the people who loved him. There is a sense of bewilderment in their question. Deeds of kindness and mercy are so rooted in lives sustained by God’s love that they don’t immediately recognize their care for others as works for the King. Their service to others is just part of who they are.

Massanutten Cares 2011, an ‘all-hands-on-deck’ day of mission and service for all ages, is just around the corner. Through our shared ministry we will have opportunity to see the Lord in familiar faces and places, but also in new ways and with new brothers and sisters in Christ. What we do as we gather is a response who we are each and every day: *people who are deeply loved and firmly sustained by God’s love.*

The day begins at **8:30 a.m.** with a light breakfast and team meetings. Most work and ministry projects will conclude by **12:30 p.m.** I hope you will join in this opportunity to serve together. Radical Hospitality, Passionate Worship, Intentional Faith Development, Risk-Taking Mission and Service, and Extravagant Generosity

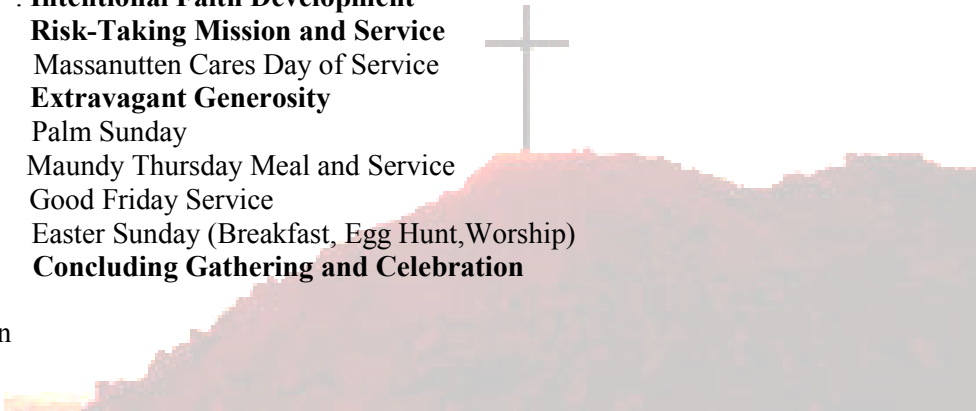

Getting To Know You...

A Few Moments with our New Members — the Hollands

If you never thought of the Shenandoah Valley as having a European flair, just talk to Stefanie Holland. Though she's 4000 miles from her hometown, Stefanie feels right at home in McGaheysville. "It looks like Bavaria," says the native of Germany, who lives in Massanutten with husband Marlan, and children Megan (7), and T.J. (4).

But the path to her home-away-from-home was not a straight one. She and Marlan met in his hometown of Savannah, Georgia, where Stefanie worked at a German firm after moving to the United States. The couple then moved to Tucson, Arizona. As a federal agent there, Marlan was working on an increasingly dangerous border. Because his job environment was stressful and the public schools in Tucson were not an ideal option for their children, they made their way back East and settled in Virginia in 2007. Marlan is employed with U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement, and Stefanie now serves as planning and scheduling manager for Dynamic Aviation in Bridgewater. The family loves that Virginia is steeped in history, and regularly ventures out to visit our area's many historic sites and museums.

Finding their church home was the result of a little research and a fun-filled week at Vacation Bible School. Marlan grew up a Southern Baptist and Stefanie grew up Catholic, but both were looking for a different faith experience for their family. After researching a lot of belief systems, they determined that the Presbyterian denomination was the best fit for their family. "We visited different churches, but what really inspired us was attending Vacation Bible School at MPC," says Stefanie. "We loved it. There was just this great energy. That's what really did it for us. We fell in love with the MPC church community." The Hollands joined our congregation in September, 2010.

When not day-tripping, the family of avid readers is at home enjoying their books. Marlan is very interested in history and politics. "We joke that he's building his presidential library down in his man cave," Stefanie says, laughing. Stefanie enjoys books from a variety of genres and participates in a book club with her colleagues. Megan is a voracious reader and even T.J. is picking up the family hobby by perusing his big sister's early-reader books. The kids enjoy more active pursuits as well. T.J. plays tee ball. Megan is playing softball this spring and loves to sing in the Cherub Choir.

The Hollands have enjoyed learning about the many Christian education and fellowship opportunities at MPC. Megan is a regular Faith Village attendee and T.J. is looking forward to joining his big sister at Sunday school. Marlan and Stefanie are eager to participate in more adult education programs and Marlan would like to explore the idea of starting a children's sports program within our congregation.

Meanwhile, Stefanie reports that while she misses her family in Germany, she has become "completely Americanized" and can't imagine moving back. We are so pleased that the Holland's travels led them to MPC, and are glad to welcome them into our church family.
