During the summer the Leggett family will attend the Worship and Music Conference at Montreat NC, Pastor John will represent the Presbytery of Shenandoah as a commissioner to the 219th General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA and also participate in a workshop entitled *Writing and the Pastoral Life: A Week with Richard Lischer* at the Colledgeville Institute.

Sabbatical is a time set apart from the normal routine and is an opportunity for all of us to reflect on our journey, both as individuals and as part of the Body of Christ. We also have the opportunity to find new ways to engage in the work of the Church.

We have a Sabbatical Planning Committee that has been introduced in a letter to the congregation. Dale Dobroth, Ellen Blose and Betsy Hay have assisted Pastor John, Pastor Ann and the rest of staff in planning our path through the summer. The Planning Committee has prepared a Frequently Asked Questions page to assist us as we learn about the changes ahead. Any one of them will answer additional questions that may arise.

Pastor Ann, Session, staff and all of us continuing to work together will make this special time an enriching experience for us all.

MPC Education Grants/ Scholarships Available...

The Stewardship and Finance Ministry is now accepting applications for grants/scholarships to be awarded this fall. Any member of Massanutten who is a graduating high senior and has been accepted by a two year or four year institute of higher education, or a person enrolling in a Presbyterian Seminary for a degree in the ministry or a degree in Christian education is eligible.

Under the Radar: Gertrude Irvine

It was Mother's Day—one of those “thin places” in the calendar when the folk who have crossed over into the Church Triumphant crowd up on the other side, in hopes of dialogue with those of us still here. I scanned the group looking for a familiar and beloved face and was astonished to hear her voice at my elbow. “Hello, Son!” I felt the force of her voice, the health that had been absent in my last view of her in 2001 when she had just died at age 104. Turning, I felt strength and authority radiating from her. Eagerly I reached out to embrace her, but felt myself blocked. “Not yet, Son,” she said. “There will be a time for that. Look forward to it.”

“Is it really you, Mother?” I said. “You look different, somehow.”

“It is I, Gertrude Williamson White Irvine, Mrs. John Montgomery Irvine the Third. Here in Resurrection Country we are given new names; but for you I will still answer to “Mother.” And expect us to look different somehow. Even his close friends didn't recognize the risen Jesus right off.”

“Mother,” I said, sensing a great opportunity, “let me interview you for my column in the MPC newsletter.”

“All right, Son, as long as you realize I can't let you in on the future ahead of time. I don't even know it myself, except for what the Bible tells us. But we can talk about the past.”

“Mother, given your family background, when you moved to Sunnyside in 1985 you were used to a busy level of activity in whatever church you attended. I suspect that was true of your entry into MPC. But you weren't the Energizer Bunny you had been in earlier years. It must have been something of a comedown to have a vigorous church to belong to but not the physical vigor any more to match the challenge.”

“Yes. It was a comedown. But It did not shut me down completely. I could—and did—pray for the church, its leaders and its programs and its outreach. There were some groups I could attend, and share insights with. And there was always worship, as long as I was able to get there to enjoy it.”

“Mother, one of the great learnings I have had in my later years has been an awareness of how much prayer support you gave me, as well as the church, across the years, and how much I have missed that since your death. This says to me that I was pretty tone-deaf to prayer in earlier years. You probably wondered if I'd ever catch on to what it meant to you back then.”

“Yes, I did wonder. And I did pray about it, along with many other things. But I trusted that you'd catch on, and you did. But who says prayer has to stop when a person dies, son? There is a lot of prayer going on here all the time. Praise and thanksgiving are plentiful here, and intercession goes up before the Throne constantly. As I did as a part of MPC, so I still do: pray it will be a faithful church that freely transmits God's blessings to its people and its neighbors.”

“Mother, let's talk about your experiences at the national church level, back when you were in your late 40s and early 50s. As President of the National Council of Women's Organizations of the Presbyterian Church in the U.S.A., you were asked to speak to gatherings of women all across the country, and to be one of six delegates from that denomination—and the only woman among them—to the first Assembly of the World Council of Churches in 1948 in Amsterdam in Holland. After that great meeting ended you went behind the Iron Curtain into Hungary and Czechoslovakia to bring greetings to women's groups and ascertain needs that their U.S. sisters in the faith might help meet. In 1955 you went to Brazil to visit mission work there to the same ends. To have had such opportunities must have been extremely exciting. How hard was it to scale back down into normal life after you came home from these distant places?”

“Remember that I had opportunities to speak about these adventures to many audiences, and so it was not like there was a sharp cutoff. There is also enough drama in our most ordinary days of living the faith to keep one's excitement level up, if we only have eyes to see it. And even if a particular day or cause might seem “flat,” there is always the promise of the future where ‘What no eye has seen, nor ear heard, nor the human heart conceived, what God has prepared for those who love him—these things God has revealed to us through the Spirit, for the Spirit searches everything, even the depths of God.’ Son, never think that life here is boring. I talk with people here all the time who don't know my language and I don't know theirs. But just like at the first Pentecost, the Spirit enables us to have wonderful, and wonderfully understood, conversations. Every time I come on something here that seems to be perfect, it blossoms into something even more perfect. I think of our love of music and how a great composer brings everything to a mighty climax and leaves us so satisfied we want nothing more. But imagine that growing out swiftly from that is a still grander climax nobody, including the composer, had ever thought of—but the Holy Spirit did. *Continued next page:*

But I must go, before we get into things you are not yet ready to understand. Yet it won't be long, Son, before we can be here together. Your father sends his love. Thanks for calling me to you through your memories."

My heart was breaking as she faded away. But I knew afresh why she was a person of such influence: a preacher's kid who grew up to demonstrate a truly dedicated life, who inspired so many people, and who gave me life—lots of life. Mother, MPC was blessed to have you for the last sixteen years of your earthly life, and I was blessed to have you for 73 years. Thank God!

Nashville churches, PDA work to respond to, assess flood damage

NASHVILLE — Personnel from [Presbyterian Disaster Assistance](#) have set up offices in Franklin, Tenn., beginning a long process of assessment in order to implement disaster recovery efforts.

PDA now has information on its website on how to help. And it is beginning to organize a hosting site at [Westminster Presbyterian Church](#) in Nashville. This congregation's session voted unanimously on May 8 to host volunteer work teams coming to the stricken area. Work teams from outside Tennessee can make plans to help by contacting PDA.
