Getting to Know You

A Few Moments with our New Member – Lou Gardner

Whether headed for a one-room mountain schoolhouse in Oroville, CA, the palatial Trump Tower in Chicago, or MPC's sanctuary for a piano recital, Lou Gardner always carries one thing with her: gratitude.

Sunnyside resident Mary Louisa Land Gardner was born in 1926 in Oroville, CA, where her family owned and operated a lumber company. As a child, she rode the bus 1½ hours each way to a one-room schoolhouse and spent countless glorious days swimming and riding her horse in the rural town of Feather Falls. On weekends she had a vastly different experience, staying with her grandmother in a large, well-appointed city home enjoying formal teas. "It really was two completely different, wonderful worlds," says Lou chuckling. "My only childhood disappointment was I never got to have white shoes like Shirley Temple." She went on to graduate from Yuba College and then earned a liberal arts degree from the University of California at Berkeley.

Lou met her future husband, George Auskar Gardner, at a U.S. Camp Beale Service Club dance during World War II. He was there with his company awaiting deployment to Japan. But, during the wait, the atom bomb was dropped and the war ended -- paving the way for their superb romance. Lou and George were married in Oroville in August, 1951. They moved to George's hometown of Pittsburgh, PA, where he had graduated from the University of Pittsburgh with an electrical engineering degree. From there, they moved to Dayton, OH, where they lived and worked for 55 years before retiring to Harrisonburg in 2007.

George passed away this past December, but you won't find Lou lost in grief. "I am so blessed to have had 59 years with such a wonderful man," she says. During their time together, Lou enjoyed being an involved wife, homemaker and mother to her three children, Kathleen, Carole and George. She was involved with the PTA, Jobs Daughters, Native Daughters of the Golden West, OCIC Investment Club, the church choir, Girl Scouts, and Campfire Girls. After being burglarized in 1981, she joined the Neighborhood Watch Program. And she and George delivered food for Meals on Wheels.

The couple moved to Harrisonburg to be closer to children Kathleen and Skip Wissinger, Carole and Rob Gould of Warrenton, and George and Carla Gardner of Greenville, SC. But retirement didn't slow Lou down much. She loves our "wonderful" church, and joined us this past March. Lou is an avid reader who especially likes biographies and loves to pour over her mother's old books. She enjoys scrapbooking, writing letters, cooking, church, singing and traveling. She gushes about her recent trip to Chicago with a long-time Dayton friend, and finds fulfillment working on the "Stamps for Missions" project and volunteering at the Sunnyside gift shop.

Most of all however, Lou loves being with her family. This has grown to include a multitude of grandchildren and young great-grandchildren, Jackson and Adelaide Perry, who are preschoolers. What are her hopes for the littlest of her brood? "I want them to know our Lord, to honor their mother and father, to be honest, compassionate and respectful. To be good neighbors and citizens," she adds. "I was very lucky to have a good family and I've cherished that. I want them to cherish that, too. I feel so very sorry for people who don't have those important family connections."

Lou and George have both chronicled their life experiences in family history books they are passing on to their children and grandchildren. It is likely their prose is soaked with the same gratitude Lou has carried with her throughout her life. "Truly, I have been very fortunate in health and everything else," Lou concludes. "I am very, very grateful."

And we are grateful she is here with us, sharing her experiences and love of God. Welcome Lou!

Situation Report

U.S. Spring Storms

April 28, 2011

In the past few days we have seen severe and devastating storms ravage the Midwestern, Southern, and Eastern United States. During April 2011, more than 300 tornadoes were confirmed. As we pray for all who have been affected by these events, we remember that “Our help is in the name of the Lord, who made heaven and earth” (Psalm 124:8) and call on the saving power of the Lord Jesus Christ, whom “even the winds and sea obey” (Matthew 8:27).

Especially hard hit were states in the South. April 27 tornadoes caused 130 deaths in Alabama alone. Lives were also lost in Mississippi, Tennessee, Georgia and Virginia, bringing the preliminary total to about 200. That number is expected to rise, officials said.

PDA Response

At the request of the 11 presbyteries in 10 states, members of the PDA National Response Team (NRT) are working to help leaders as they organize their response for local communities. PDA is monitoring a number of additional presbyteries in case a need for assistance arises. A number of NRT members are on stand-by status.
